A Message from Pastor Kim

Building a future hope in faith together -

When I first started as your pastor in January of 2021, we were deep in the throes of the Covid-19 Pandemic in the state of wearing masks, social distancing, and learning new ways of doing worship. It was a strange world, and a strange state to learn about a people that I was going to serve in the ministry when most of your faces were covered. It was a weird time and place to think about the future and think of the what and how we could and can be church.

Some of us were scared, keeping our distance (with good reason for health concerns), some of us were cautious about how we went about things, and some of us saw it as a moment to reevaluate our ministry and future focus. (<—the latter being me, your pastor, and a handful of brave and vulnerable people.)

The pandemic indeed was hard, but it also proved to us that we did see our way through with a faith led not by sight but by trust. Trust that we would, like those who had gone before us, that this too shall pass, and in the meantime it would be a good time to do a church self-evaluation, a self-check-up, and see what was serving us, and what could be let go of, and what soil could be turned over with new seeds planted in the hopes of new growth.

When I looked at the good foundations you all have processed through in your long-range planning, I understood and could see that you all were a good people who just needed some nurturing, love, encouragement, and energy to inspire a new and venturesome spirit.

Even in the midst of a pandemic, people came together with plans for the future, plans for areas of our church to be improved, to be welcoming, to bring in different forms of music and worship, and to physically build an outdoor structure that would not only serve our faith community but our surrounding area with a place of beauty, rest, and restoration.

Through our almost three years together, we have welcomed 29 new members, baptized 16 babies, and laid to rest in the promise of the resurrection —32 of our founding members. We've improved our narthex to include a welcoming center, to greet well known people of our congregation, as well as those seeking a new church home, and visitors who need a bit of nature and spiritual food for their travels. We've improved our ecological carbon footprint by replacing all our lighting with LED bulbs. We've installed screens in our narthex and sanctuary to better aid the inclusion of all people in our worship services. Our music has evolved to include our beloved traditional hymns, the gift our of choir, the giftedness of our bell ringers, alongside a new contemporary music team. Our youth and Sunday school is rebuilding with the help of many creative volunteers and hands ready to support and pass on the baton of faith to the next generation.

The biggest undertaking that is currently in process, is our outdoor gathering and worship space, which *I am* lovingly calling our "*Timmerkirka*" — or "*Timber church*" in Swedish. During the pandemic, with all the creative ways that we learned to be a church without being IN *THE* building made us realize that, while being anchored near the beauty of Lake Superior, it was also greatly difficult to hold or plan outdoor worship in a climate that likes to change on a dime.

The idea was proposed that we should have a covered outdoor structure that would serve a multitude of needs for people gathering. From our own outdoor worship, to weddings, to baptisms, to meetings, to picnics, to concerts, or just a quiet spot to sit and rest in the beauty of creation.

We know that a timber frame isn't a cheap thing to build or create, but with your generosity it was quickly realized with money raised in full. *AND* within all of your generosity, it spoke volumes to the trust you have not only in this place, this community...but also in your faith in God and the future that God's seed of faith will continue to grow for years to come here. The welcome that this church has been to so many for the last 99 years, proves that this is a holy place believes in the future hope, a future welcome, and future benevolence in what God has given to us in generosity.

I am grateful, humbled, proud, and honored to be your pastor for the last three years and look forward to much more growth together for many years to come. So thankful for the strength of faith you have in each other and especially in Christ in your ministry today and into the future. Continue to trust in what we can do together. Be generous, kind, and loving in the work we all do with Christ at our center.





Lessons This Month

August 6 - Tenth Sunday after Pentecost

Isaiah 55:1-5; Psalm 145:8-9, 14-21; Romans 9:1-5; Matthew 14:13-21.

In today's first reading God invites all who are hungry or thirsty to receive food and drink without cost. Jesus feeds the hungry multitude and reveals the abundance of God. At the eucharistic table we remember all who are hungry or poor in our world today. As we share the bread of life, we are sent forth to give ourselves away as bread for the hungry.

August 13 - Eleventh Sunday after Pentecost 1 Kings 19:9-18; Psalm 85:8-13; Romans 10:5-15; Matthew 14:22-33.

Elijah finds the presence of God not in earthquake, wind, or fire, but in the sound of sheer silence. When the disciples face a great storm on the sea, they cry out with fear. Jesus says: "Take heart, it is I; do not be afraid." Amid the storms of life, we gather to seek the calm presence of Christ that soothes our fears. In comforting words of scripture and in the refreshing bread and cup of the eucharist, God grants us peace and sends us forth to be a sign of God's presence to others.

August 20 - Twelfth Sunday after Pentecost Isaiah 56:1, 6-8; Psalm 67; Romans 11:1-2a, 29-32; Matthew 15:[10-20] 21-28.

In Isaiah we hear that God's house shall be a house of prayer for all people and that God will gather the outcasts of Israel. The Canaanite woman in today's gospel is a Gentile, an outsider, who is unflinching in her request that Jesus heal her daughter. As Jesus commends her bold faith, how might our church extend its mission to those on the margins of society? In our gathering around word and meal we receive strength to be signs of comfort, healing, and justice for those in need.

August 27 – Thirteenth Sunday after Pentecost

Isaiah 51:1-6; Psalm 138; Romans 12:1-8; Matthew 16:13-20.

In Isaiah the people are advised to look to their spiritual ancestors as the rock from which they were hewn. Jesus declares that the church will be built on the rock of Peter's bold confession of faith. God's word of reconciliation and God's mercy are keys to the church's mission. Paul urges us to not be conformed to this world but to offer our bodies as a living sacrifice, using our individual gifts to build up the body of Christ. From the table we go forth to offer our spiritual worship through word and deed.


