## A Message from Pastor Kim



Advent is here, the beginning of the giant holiday Season. Between the different religions of the world, there are over 14 different celebrations between November 2nd -

Jan 15th. Thus the reason for the phrase, "Happy Holidays," and when broken down to its linguistic origin means - Happy Holy Days.

Also within this season, there are often complaints about the word or usage of" X-mas". "They've taken Christ out of Christmas," decry some. But in actuality, X-mas is the most Christ focused way of honoring the coming Christ in this season.

The holiday itself might have been replaced by commercialism in the celebration of this Festival season, but that isn't where the "X" comes from. Christ isn't being "crossed out."

Now as Christians we prepare and gather together to get our hearts ready for Christ to be born into our chaotic world. The English word "Christmas" is a shortened form of "Christ's Mass". The word is first recorded as Crīstesmæsse in 1038 and Cristes-messe in 1131.

Let us journey into the formation of linguistics of the word:

The word "Christ" in Greek looks like this: XΡΙΣΤΟΣ (pronounced "christos"). Christ comes

"The Parables" † December 2023 † page 3 from the Greek word χριστός (chrīstós), meaning "anointed one". The word is derived from the Greek verb χρίω (chr̄iō), meaning "to anoint." In the Greek Septuagint, χριστός was a semantic loan used to translate the Hebrew (Mašíah, messiah), meaning "[one who is] anointed."

(Phew.. does your brain hurt a little from this mini theological deep dive? Take a deep breath because we are going back to the surface. )



Okay back to XΡΙΣΤΟΣ....The

first letter is an "X," but it isn't pronounced as an "ex" as in our alphabet, but a "chi" (rhymes with "sky") in the Greek alphabet. This letter has a "ch" sound - like in the word "Christ".

While the second letter looks like a P (pea), but in Greek it is a "Rho" and sounds like the English "R". Now we put them together.

The "chi rho" is common Christian symbol that uses the first two letters from XPI $\Sigma$ TO $\Sigma$ . Because of the shape of the letters, the symbol is often mistaken for a "PX". A chi-rho symbol is one of the oldest Christian symbols. Some examples of the Chi-Rho symbols are attached. There are different ones in our congregation in our liturgical décor.

Spelling the holiday "Xmas" doesn't necessarily take Christ out of the holiday; neither does spelling the word "Christmas" put Christ into the holiday. They are mutually exclusive of one another and can be used interchangeably.

If you hear someone getting feisty about the "abbreviated" form of Christmas, you can show them this article and give them a mini-lesson on Biblical Greek and the history of how appropriate X-mas actually is for us all. Hopefully, that will lessen their concern and enlighten them to rejoice that we all can welcome the Jesus into

French River Lutheran Church our hearts in a variety of ways.

Christ is coming into our hearts and might in so many different ways. This is the season to help open minds and understanding to the mystery and good will that He brings to all.





## **Greetings**


Hello FRLC friends!

## **Lessons This Month**

## **December 3 - First Sunday of Advent**

<u>Isaiah 64:1-9</u>; <u>Psalm 80:1-7, 17-19</u>; <u>1 Corinthians 1:3-9</u>; <u>Mark 13:24-37</u>.

Stir up your power, and come! The psalmist's plea in Psalm 80:2 has become familiar to us in the Advent prayers. Isaiah wants God to rip the heavens open. Both cry out for an apparently distant, angry God to show up, to save, to restore. When we hear Jesus describing the coming of the Son of Man with stars falling from heaven, it can sound dire and horrible, not like anything we would ever hope for. But when we really look at the suffering of people God loves, we can share the hope that God would tear open the heavens and come.

## **December 10 – Second Sunday of Advent**

<u>Isaiah 40:1-11; Psalm 85:1-2, 8-13;</u> <u>2 Peter 3:8-15a; Mark 1:1-8.</u>

John calls people to repent, to clear the decks, to completely reorder their lives so that nothing gets in the way of the Lord's coming. The reading from Isaiah gives the context for this radical call: the assurance of forgiveness that encourages us to repent; the promise that the coming one will be gentle with the little ones. Isaiah calls us all to be heralds with John, to lift up our voices fearlessly and say, "See, your God is coming!" We say it to one another in worship, in order to say it with our lives in a world in need of justice and peace.

#### **December 17 – Third Sunday of Advent**

<u>Isaiah 61:1-4, 8-11; Psalm 126;</u> <u>Luke 1:46b-55</u> (alternate);

1 Thessalonians 5:16-24; John 1:6-8, 19-28.

"Rejoice always," begins the reading from 1 Thessalonians. Isaiah and the psalmist make clear that God is turning our mourning into laughter and shouts of joy. "All God's children got a robe," go the words of a spiritual. It is not so much a stately, formal, pressed outfit as it is a set of party clothes, clothes we are happy to wear. We receive that robe in baptism, and in worship we gather for a foretaste of God's party.

#### **December 24 – Fourth Sunday of Advent**

2 <u>Samuel 7:1-11, 16; Luke 1:46b-55;</u> <u>Psalm 89:1-4, 19-26</u> (alternate); <u>Romans 16:25-27; Luke 1:26-38.</u>

God keeps the promise made to David to give him an everlasting throne. The angel tells Mary that God will give David's throne to her son Jesus. She is perplexed by Gabriel's greeting and by the news of her coming pregnancy, but she is able still to say, "Count me in." We who know that Jesus is called king only as he is executed still find it a mystery hard to fathom, but with Mary today we hear the news of what God is up to and say, "Count us in."

## **December 31 – First Sunday of Christmas**

<u>Isaiah 61:10--62:3; Psalm 148;</u> <u>Galatians 4:4-7; Luke 2:22-40.</u>

The psalmist calls on the natural world, celestial bodies, fire and earth, creatures, and all humanity, to praise God. The voices of Simeon and 84-year-old Anna join the chorus today, recognizing what God is doing in Jesus. Simeon's song is often sung after communion, for we have seen God's salvation in the assembled community and have held Jesus in our hands in the bread. Then, like the prophet Anna, we tell of Jesus to all who look for the healing of the world.

## **CHUM News** -A Place For Warmth

On November 1<sup>st</sup>, we opened our Warming Center again for the season. On the very first night we had 52 guests, and we are expecting that number will only continue to rise. The low on that Wednesday night was in the 20s. If you can't stay dry in conditions like that, frostbite can set in faster than you would expect. That Wednesday night, we made sure that 52 people in our community were safe. We made sure that 52 people in


