

Sabbatical Re-Proposal for Pastor Kim Sturtz

Dear Council and Congregation: As many of you know, earlier in the year I had notified you all of my application for a Sabbatical Grant from the Lilly Endowment for Clergy Renewal for up to \$60,000 to help pay for a 3 month sabbatical, which would help my travel and renewal and pulpit supply.

As of August 28, I was notified that I <u>did not</u> receive the grant, likely because of a high application number for only 125 grants. This is likely due to delayed sabbaticals and sabbatical applications because of the Covid-19 Pandemic. So with anything where your heart and soul were determined was going to happen, there was a bit of grief and some mourning. But then, we wait for the Spirit of God to show us a new plan and a new experience. A *Funky town* needed moment (for me) in listening to what to do next.

Part One Sabbatical Re-Proposal:

On *August 30*, I received a call from our Bishop Amy Odgren, in the Northeastern Minnesota Synod, in connection with our NEMN Synod Companion Synod Coordinators, Pr. Mark and Brenda Wagner, inviting me to join them on a THREE WEEK trip to one of our Companion Synods in South Andhra, India,

in **January of 2024** *(January 14- Feb 3)*. This has been a delayed visit due to the Pandemic, as well and is 4 years overdue. They are inviting me in a small

"The Parables" † October 2023 † page 3 group of our bishop and clergy to visit and represent our Synod and Clergy leadership in Northern Minnesota as well as the larger ELCA. There will be visits to the various churches and seminarians with whom our mission supports and accompanies.

The cost of the trip -**\$4300,** would be covered with **\$1800** from Synod Companion Journey Scholarship, **\$2000 from my continuing education** as part of my call, <u>and **\$500 to pay on**</u> <u>**my own to journey.**</u> (Checked in with our Financial Treasurer to make sure the continuing ed money is still available - yes) This visit would include visiting historical and spiritual places such as the Taj Mahal, Mother Theresa's Home for children and burial grounds, The Lutheran Seminary of Southern India, The Basilica of the Apostle of St. Thomas, Henry Martin Institute of Education and Christian Formation. Cities Visited would be New Delhi, Hyderabad, Tirupati, Chennai, India.

In discussion with our executive council, larger council, and financial treasurer, this opportunity would present many positive avenues for ministry, sabbatical needs, and continuing education. Sabbatical rest and renewal-wise, this trip would provide insight for myself into a new form of spiritual journey and pilgrimage. While it is not my original plan to visit the homeland of my ancestors, it will create and understanding of what it was like to leave on a big journey, to a new place, with new ways of life, and see what the Global church is doing within my ministry as well as our congregation in accompaniment the larger church of God in Christ Jesus. I would consider this journey 1 month of my 3 month sabbatical requirement. I would return the first Sunday in February to leadership in our church through Lent, Easter, to Pentecost Sunday.

Part Two Sabbatical Re-Proposal:

As of *June 9- July 31, 2024* — I will begin the second part of sabbatical. This will be a journey around to visit family in the USA that I haven't seen for years and reconnect, take a few retreats in, also take a few folk art classes that connect back to my heritage. *I would return as of the first Sunday in August 2024* to help with the final plans for the 100th Anniversary of French River Lutheran Church.

<u>*Needed for this New Sabbatical</u> <u>Plan/Proposal:</u>

Pastoral Sabbatical Pay: salary during this 3 month break with Benefits.

Pastoral Coverage:

<u>I. Sunday Worship</u>: Pulpit Supply, either One Clergy for all of it, or select dates for multiple ministers.

II. Weekly Pastoral Care: The need of home visits, hospital visits, or other acts of sacramental needs (examples: Baptisms, Funerals, Weddings) III. Contact with Synod Office about coverage, and lining up retired clergy, deacons, or Synodically Authorized Ministers to help cover the Sabbatical. (Please see the NEMN SABBATICAL Guideline Doc of 2023 for more information and for any questionsattached below)

With what I learn and experience in both Spiritual connections in India, and Spiritual Reconnection with family and self-care, will be a form of sabbatical and renewal, and a way of still honoring the fulfillment of our congregation's plan to have my sabbatical in the year of 2024. Also this is helpful in the fact that I will be back at an early date in Summer, to be able to aid in the celebration of 100 years of French River Lutheran.

I hope this new proposal will be well received and approved by all. I am excited for the new opportunity that the Spirit is presenting to us in the way of creating new partnerships in our accompaniment in Christ. This is a reminder also that it's not always the plan that we make in learning more about ourselves or our faith, that might open new ways of experiencing Spiritual pilgrimages we should take at some point in our lives, whether abroad or here at home. But here is a great example of God's guidance and encouragement in ways we never expected.

Lessons This Month

October 1 – Eighteenth Sunday after Pentecost <u>Ezekiel 18:1-4, 25-32</u>; <u>Psalm 25:1-9</u>; Philipping 2:1, 12: Matthew 21:22, 22

Philippians 2:1-13; Matthew 21:23-32.

Jesus' parable about two sons who don't do what they say reveals surprises in the reign of God. In the reading from Ezekiel the people claim the ways of the Lord are unfair, while God offers repentance and new life. Paul urges us to look to Christ as a model of humility, putting the interests of others above our own. Nourished by the broken bread and shared cup, we offer our lives for the sake of our needy world.

October 8 – Nineteenth Sunday after Pentecost

<u>Isaiah 5:1-7; Psalm 80:7-15; Philippians 3:4b-14;</u> <u>Matthew 21:33-46</u>.

In today's gospel reading, Jesus tells a vineyard parable, which serves as an image of Israel, the prophets' mission, and Christ's death. For Christians, the vineyard also speaks of God's love poured out in the blood of Christ, given to us for the forgiveness of sin. Grafted onto Christ the vine at baptism, we are nourished with wine and bread so that we may share Christ's sufferings and know the power of his resurrection.

October 15 – Twentieth Sunday after Pentecost

<u>Isaiah 25:1-9; Psalm 23; Philippians 4:1-9;</u> <u>Matthew 22:1-14</u>.

In Isaiah we are given a vision of the great feast to come, when God will wipe away death forever. In Jesus' parable about a great banquet, those invited do not come, so the invitation is extended to others. In our liturgy God spreads a table before us. Even amid anxiety and hardship we rejoice in the peace of God which surpasses all understanding. With great joy we feast at the table of the Lord, and we go forth to share the wonderful invitation with others hungering and thirsting for the abundant life of God.

October 22 – Twenty-First Sunday after Pentecost

<u>Isaiah 45:1-7;</u> Psalm 96:1-9 [10-13]; 1 Thessalonians 1:1-10; Matthew 22:15-22.

In today's first reading God uses the Gentile ruler Cyrus to accomplish divine purposes. When the Pharisees try to trap Jesus, he tells them to give the emperor what belongs to him and to God what belongs to God. To gather for worship reminds us that our ultimate allegiance is to God rather than to any earthly authority. Created in the image of God, we offer our entire selves in the service of God and for the sake of the world.



French River Lutheran Church October 29 – Twenty-Second Sunday after Pentecost

Leviticus 19:1-2, 15-18; Psalm 1; 1 Thessalonians 2:1-8; Matthew 22:34-46.

Jesus' summary of the law in today's gospel echoes our first reading from Leviticus. We are called not only to love God with heart, soul, and mind, but also to love our neighbor as ourselves. It is out of such deep care that Paul shares the gospel with the Thessalonian community. In the confession of sins, we acknowledge that we have not loved God, neighbor, and self; yet we gather to hear the word of forgiveness and to be strengthened by word and meal to be signs of God's love and mercy in the world.
